SSVF Program Overview

SSVF Services Include the following:

- A Stabilization case manager that works with each Veteran
- Comprehensive referral services for employment opportunities, legal services, healthcare and more
- Help obtaining VA and other public benefits
- Individualized housing and financial assistance stability plans
- Temporary financial assistance for housing needs and related expenses







Veterans Legal Services Overview

- Veterans Legal Services is a non-profit organization that provides free civil legal aid to economically disadvantaged veterans in MA.
- VLS was founded in 1991 by law students who recognized that the legal needs of residents at the New England Center & Home for Veterans (NECHV), a shelter and service center, were going unmet.
- VLS's Senior Staff Attorney, Julie Frohlich, Esq., runs the legal clinic at NECHV for VLS.

Typical Case Mix for A NECHV Clinic

- 1. Landlord-Tenant dispute, post-possession arrearage, security deposit
- 2. Discharge upgrade
- 3. Child Custody and Support Arrangements, Modifications
- 4. Benefits appeal
- 5. Divorce
- 6. CORI sealing
- 7. RMV/OUI Suspension





NECHV Screening and Referral Process

Legal clinics are scheduled each week and are by appointment only.

- 1. Weekly Case Conferences are conducted to identify legal issues to be referred to Legal clinic. Veterans Legal Services lawyer is in attendance at case conferences and conducts trainings for Staff. In addition, case managers refer Veterans independently.
- NECHV case manager Reviews whether veteran might be eligible for help from VLS.
 - o History of Military Service
 - o Civil Legal Issue
 - o SSVF Income Eligible (50% Area Median Income (AMI))
 - o Massachusetts Resident
- 3. Complete Legal Clinic Referral Form.
- 4. Ensure veteran read, completed, and signed an Authorization for Release of Information.

Levels of Service

- Brief Advice and Counsel in One Time Phone Conversation
 - –No court appearance
 - —Typically no further contact after phone call
 - Examples CORI question, criminal case status
- Limited Assistance Representation
 - -Typically assistance filling out court forms
 - –Advice and counsel
 - –No court appearance
- Full-blown representation
 - -All in
 - –Court appearances
